He also gave a check to Walker Bros. for \$5.00 signed the same name and one to Nathan & Krauss for \$3.75 and signed "A. Tucker." As soon as the checks went in to the bank the forgeries were detected and officers at Ballinger notified. Sheriff Flynt went to Winters immediately and succeeded in making the arrest before Taylor had time to make his get-away.


