James Wright of Eastland is County Veterans Service Officer and he explained that the applications for loans for the purchase of land by veterans will be processed through the County Veterans Land Committee, with the local group having the authority to investigate the applicant, and the property being considered, in order to make recommendations to the state veterans land board for approval.

Application blanks are to be secured directly from the Veterans Land Board it was stated, and there is no waiting period now. A veteran merely makes application when he has found the land he wants to buy.

He is Chairman of the Committee on House Administration in the House of Representatives, and ranks second from the Chairman on the Committee on Foreign Affairs.

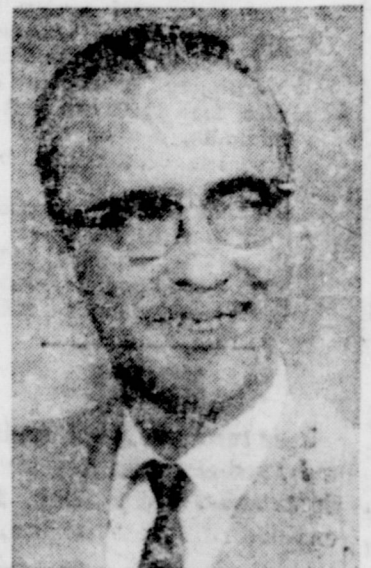
Final Rites Are Held For Obie Elrod

Pietraszek Is Candidate For County Office

Seven Million Vehicles Due To Be Registered This Year

AUSTIN — State Highway Engineer J. C. Dingwall today announced that Texas will register approximately 7 million vehicles during 1968. "This is the largest number in our history," Mr. Dingwall said.

All 1968 Texas license plates have been delivered to the 254 county tax assessor-collectors for issuance during February and March of 1968.

Of the estimated 7 million vehicles to be registered, the Texas Highway Department believes that 4.75 million will be passenger cars and 1.9

million will be commercial trucks and truck tractors. Trailers and motorcycles will account for the balance.

The most dramatic increase is expected in the motorcycle category, based on the past two years' experience. While passenger car and commercial truck registration will increase about 3 1/2 per cent, motorcycle registration is expected to increase 16 per cent. This follows a 25 per cent increase in motorcycles in 1966 over 1965 and another 17 per cent increase last year.

Motor vehicle owners can avoid long lines by registering during the month of February, rather than waiting until the March rush.

Owners should bring four items to the Tax Collector's office when registering vehicles: certificate of title, 1967 license receipt, current resident address, and zip code.

State law requires each owner to register his vehicle in the county in which he resides and to present his certificate of title as evidence of ownership.

During the 1967 session the Texas Legislature amended the Texas Registration Law by changing passenger car license fees and establishing a minimum fee of \$5.30 for all vehicles, including boat trailers.

The new rates for passenger cars are as follows:
Up to 3,500 pounds - \$12.30
3,501 - 4,500 pounds - \$22.30
4,501 - 6,000 pounds - \$30.30.

ASC Farmer Committee System Is 32 Years Old, Meredith Reports

This year, 1968, the elected farmer committee system of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service will be 32 years old.

Jesse G. Meredith, ASCS County Office Manager made this announcement at the regular ASC county committee meeting on Jan. 23. Members serving on the ASC county committee this year are Robert G. Lyerla, Chairman, of Eastland, Charles Little of Eastland, and Paul Norris of Gorman.

The committee administers action on farm programs in the county level, including price support and production adjustment, conservation cost-sharing and others. Principal commodity programs administered by the local committee are: 910 peanut allotment farms, 244 wheat allotment farms, 135 cotton allotment farms, and 970 feed grain base farms.

The county office manager said that farmer committees were authorized by the Agricultural Adjustment Act of 1933. However, in those early years committees were appointed. Since 1936 ASC county and community committees have been elected. Congress currently prescribes the election procedures for ASC committees.

"Farmers like the committee system, as nearly as I can tell," Mr. Meredith said. "It gives them a local voice

in setting yields, establishing allotments, setting up rates of cost-sharing on conservation work and other important policy determinations that protect farmers at the producer level of operation."

Mr. Meredith also pointed out that the elected committee system constitutes a pipeline for ideas and suggestions for improving farm programs. Farmer elected committees act as agents for their neighbors in linking local farmers with the Department of Agriculture in Washington.

The ASC committee invites all farmers, farm groups and others interested in Agriculture to take advantage of this pipeline to help bring new solutions and fresh approaches to ever-changing farm programs, Mr. Meredith said.
