# THE COMMERCIAL USE OF TEXAS HIGHWAYS IS A PRIVILEGE, NOT A RIGHT 

> - The highways of Texas are the property of its citizens. They constitute a syatem of nearly 200,000 miles of road of which 20,000 miles are desig. nated as State highways and the remainder are county roads. All types of road are represented in thls system, lees than $5 \%$ have so-called "permament" surface.
The total cost of these highways is unknown but it amounts to many hundred million doflars. From 1917 to 1980, Inclusive, counties and road districts of the State issued $\$ 243,592,884$ in bonds for the construction and Improvement of roads and bridges. In the two-year period ending August 81, 1930, the State Highway Commission expended $\$ 89,032,825$, of which 22,488,426 was for maintenance of thr State highweys.
In view of these tremendous costs the preservation of our highways from rapid wear and destruction is a matter of जery vital interest to their ownors, vis., the public. It is especially important that they be made to outlast the life of the bonds, which run from 20 to 30 years.
The use of the public highways for commercial purposes is not a right but a privilege which may be withheld or granted subject to such restric tions, regulations and charges as the Legislature may see fit to impose Such regulations are intended to promote safety, preserve the highway and safeguard the interests of the public.
Texas Reilroads, which pay the entire cost of construction and mainte pance of their own roadbeds and, in addition, make substantial contributions to the cost of Texas highways, are thoroughly regulated with respect to their services, rates, methods and practices. There is no good reason why the public, sers of the highways, built and maintained at the expense of he publie, should not likewise be regulated to such extent as the public gterest reguires and pay such charges as will represent proper compensation for the privileges granted them

- The statutes governing highway traneportation as enacted by the Forty. ecend Leglalature represent the wishes of the eltizens of this State and orpress their dopirg to give equal rights to all and special privileges to none, Theen statutos thould be given a fair trial and thoir value asecgrtained
