LONDON, June 10.—After today's meeting of the British signatories of the Anglo-Irish treaty, it was stated by Sir Arthur Griffith, president of the Dail Eireann, that he would meet Premier Lloyd George this afternoon and that it was likely that a settlement of the questions at issue would be reached.

BOARD WILL NEED MONEY NEXT YEAR

In the event that the proposed increased tax rate is ordered by the passage of the election in the Ballinger Independent School District it will give the board of trustees something like \$9,000 more to work with.

The state aid will be cut next term \$3.00 or even more per capita, and this alone means a loss to the school of about \$2500.00. Three additional teachers have been hired that will add about \$2500 more to the expenses of the school, and these two named items will only leave about \$4000 of the increased tax money for the board to make the urgently needed repairs that will have to be made before school opens this fall.

With the full day term for all the children, three additional teachers, and another building opened which will create more expense in the way of stoves, fuel, crayon, and all the equipment used in school down to an increase in janitor service.

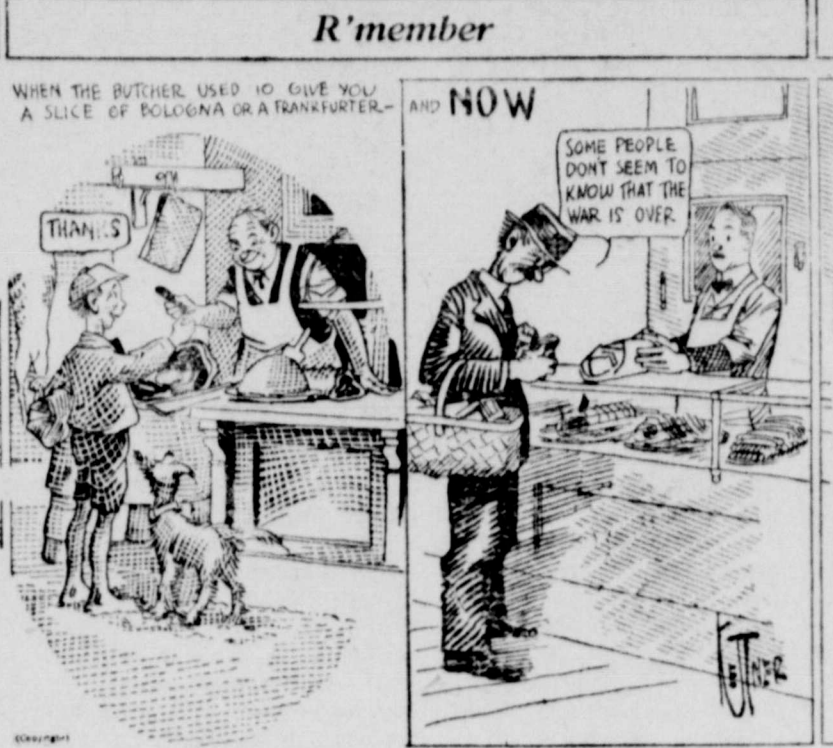
A new heating system must be installed in the high school building, a new sewerage system must be put in and many additions must be made to the school library if the pupils do first-class work. All this must be done with the additional tax money.

The schools largely make a town, and this is no time for argument, but the time for every loyal citizen to put his shoulder to the wheel and help the board give Ballinger a school system that we can point to with pride. Many people come to Ballinger every year for the school advantages we have been offering, and the day we cut our school term short or lose our affiliation we will lose those people, as no parent wants to send children to a school that is not an A-1 institution affiliated with all the state colleges and universities.

The amount this tax will raise will not cost any individual very much, and it is pointed out that citizens of Ballinger and the district cannot compare the small cost against the education and the future of our boys and girls. An education is something which is owed to the next generation and to deprive our children of this is cheating and stealing from their future as well as crippling our town and making it an undesirable place in which to live.

The board will have a very difficult time making the additional money meet the needs even of the school at present without fostering any new enterprises, and you as citizens should be glad of the opportunity to go to the polls on July 11th and cast a vote for better schools, and a vote for the better education of your children.

SUMMER NORMAL OPENS MONDAY

Ballinger will again be flooded Sunday with school teachers and students who will come here to attend the Normal and Summer School. From present indications there will be somewhere between 150 and 200 here for the opening of the school, and Prof. John J. Bugg, normal conductor, says that he is expecting by far the largest attendance in the school this summer than has been recorded at any of the previous schools held here.

The work this year will be carried on in the High School building, with Prof. J. M. Skinner in charge of the Summer School and Prof. Bugg conducting the Normal. Prof. and Mrs. John F. Priddy will also be instructors in both departments of the educational course, and will be one of the big inducements for many to attend.

The Ledger has made arrangements for a reporter from the Normal and will carry all the news from the school every day. Last year this proved very successful and many items of interest to the townspeople were reported.

Quite a number of reservations have already been made and visitors coming in Sunday will need assistance in finding their rooms.

DISORDERS ON AT COAL MINES

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., June 10.—Serious disorders broke out at the Riltr Kern coal mines near here early today, according to reports received.

Three hundred men, some armed, are reported to be forming a march on the Riltr mine. A party of one hundred white men attacked the Kern mine today and overturned several coal cars, seriously injuring one of the employes.

BALLINGER PEACHES ARRIVING ON STREET

Peaches were selling at 50 cents a basket from the cars Saturday.

McDonald had just returned from Marlin, where he had been for the benefit of his health and is in jail accused of the shooting.

WINTERS VOTES \$30,000 BONDS

In a telephone message from Ed P. Eason, of Winters, Saturday afternoon, The Ledger was informed that Winters citizens had voted for \$30,000 worth of water works bonds Friday and that the election carried in favor of the bonds to the tune of 152 for and 26 against.

Some time ago during the high water period Winters lost her city dam which supplied the town and since that time only temporary repairs have been made on the lake. With the money from the election held Friday they intend to build a much bigger lake and one that will create a water supply that will last from one rain to another.

It was stated that work would begin as soon as possible on the new water system and when the lake is filled, Winters' water problem will be solved for all time to come it is thought.

POLICE KILL NOTED CROOK

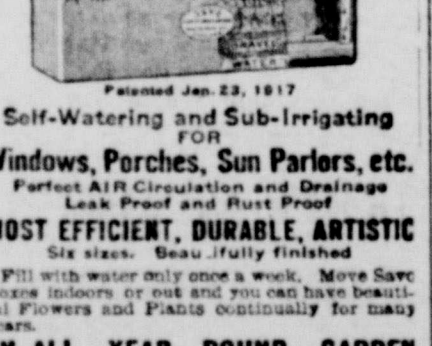

BALLINGER NEEDS "A WHITE WAY"

Discussion has been going on for some time among leading progressive citizens in regard to a "White Way" for Ballinger. It is pointed out that while the residence section of the city needs a great many more street lights than are in use at present, and will get them soon The Ledger is reliably informed that the lighting of the downtown district demands a different procedure and individual attention.

It is said that for a very small expense the local merchants could buy their own lights and have them installed on the sidewalk in front of their stores, or in case that would be too many, one light for every two regular-sized fronts could be installed and the expense divided between the two. Some firms have already put in these lamp posts, and if the proposed plan was carried out uniformly the town would present a pleasing appearance to visitors and tourists and create favorable impressions. It is also pointed out that business houses would directly benefit by putting in these lights, as crowds would be attracted to the store fronts and sales opportunities brought to the merchants' doors.

All firms that purchased lights would necessarily have to buy a uniform light and the entire fixtures would cost about \$90, it is said. If this cost was divided between two firms it would make the expense very low.

If this work is done the conduits would have to be laid before the street paving is put down. For a few days The Ledger will open its columns to anyone who has some suggestion to make in regard to a better lighted street.

While the city commission has not been approached on the subject, it is believed that authorization for free current for these street lights could be obtained, and in this way the only expense to the merchant would be the initial cost of the fixture.
