





When the local officers first came upon Garrett it is alleged he had with him a jug and upon seeing the officers disappeared into some bushes in a ravine. After the arrest, the officers in searching the ravine found one gallon of corn whiskey in a jug and two small bottles.

A search is being instituted to day for a still, which the sheriff believes is located near the scene of Garrett's arrest. However the accused man states that there is no still.


