CLEVELAND, Aug. 9.—A virtual decision was reached today by the union leaders to conclude negotiations and bring about settlement of the soft coal miners' strike with the operators who gathered here for a joint peace conference. The operators also expect an agreement to be reached affecting practically all mines in Ohio, and others in Illinois, Indiana and Pennsylvania.

A final decision on settlement of the strike rests with the union policy committee, whose members have been informed that President Lewis had the assurances of the operators outside of the four states above mentioned of their willingness to the agreement based on the one negotiated at the conference here.
