One of the chief officials of the unions declared today, that the union leaders voted unanimously to reject the proposal and after the conference a written response was sent to the White House.

The message sent to the White House by the unions told the president that they could not call off the strike unless a guarantee was given them that all their men would be reinstated in the service with all their seniority rights unimpaired.




