WACO, Jan. 13.—State rangers, under Capt. Shumate, are today holding Horace and Bernard Boucher, brothers, and Miss Naomi Boucher, sister; in connection with the killing of Grady Skipworth near this ctiy on the night of November 20th, according to local peace officers.

The whereabouts of the two men and girl could not be ascertained today, but it was authoritatively stated that they were in the custody of the officers. A complaint has been filed against the two brothers and sister charging




