## **CONFESSES TO MAKING** WALL STREET BOMB

Many details of the purported confession of Herbert Wilson, convicted murderer, alleged mail robber and former evangelist, who claims that he manufactured the bomb which blew up Wall street institutions, killing thirty-nine prsons, and which destroyed revenue measure passed by the property valued at thousands of dollars in New York on Sept. 17, 1920, are being withheld from the public for the present, the county and federal agents admitted to-day.




