





(By Associated Press) MULHEIM, Germany, April 20 -After being terrorized for three days by communist motes which held the city, Mulheim is today again under the control of con stituted German authorities.


A force of three hundred police and thirty officials which had been beseiged in the Kathaus or town hall, made a sortie from the fortress like building today and cut through the line of beseigers, caught them in the rear, arrested many of the reds and again took control of the city.

. BERLIN, April 20 .- Eight persons so far are reported dead and more than thirty wounded as the result of disturbances in Mulheim, according to dispatches received here up to noon today.

The dispatches stated that while the city had been freed from the communist grip, armed bands were still causing trouble in the outskirts of the city.




