The entertainment was being held in the second story of the building and the room was jammed with people who had gathered to witness the closing exercises of the school. A panif followed the overturning of the kerosene lamp and the cry of "Fire!"

The stairway leading to the second floor of the building collapsed as the crowd tried to rush out, causing many deaths. Others, cut off from escape by the falling of the stairway, burned to death. Others jumped from windows and were killed or injured.

The school building burned before outside aid could be summoned, and many entire families were wiped out in the horrible holocaust.




