



STATE ANNOUNCES NEW LAW CONCERNING NURSES ed to nurse under a permit.

Compulsory registration beto show her license card or permit, if requested.

All nurses registered in the State of Texas must be re-registered before July first. Re-regisration blanks may be obtained from the secretary.

The re-registration blanks must be returned to the secretary, accompanied by the fee of fifty cents (\$.50), whereupon a license will be issued which entitles applicant to nurse until March 31, 1924. 
