

record for law enforcement. "Your county attorney comes as near having everything ready for the grand jury as any man I ever saw," said Judge Woodward, and he paid the usual compliment to County Attorney Shepherd.

"Law enforcement depends up-

"I notice in his report here," said Judge Woodward, "that you have eight cases for violation of the liquor law for investigation, and there is no excuse for such violations.'

Judge Woodward stated that there were sometimes excuses for men falling out, getting mad and violating the law, but that there was no excuse for the bootlegger, the forger and burglar, and the judge urged the grand jury to go after such violators and indict them where the evidence could be had.
