CASPER, Wyoming, Sept. 28. — Several bodies were removed from the partly submerged cars of passenger train No. 30, C. B. & Q., which plunged into Coal Creek near here last night, according to reports late today, but the names of the victims are still lacking. It is probable that several bodies have been washed down stream in the raging torrent. Due to the flood they will probably never be recovered.

A relief train brought back some thirty survivors, mostly from the rear Pullmans that escaped the washout. More than a score of people were rescued from the top of the Pullmans by means of a cable running one hundred and fifty feet from the bank to the cars, the passengers escaping by coming out on the cable hand over hand. Of the injured brought here only a few are seriously hurt.

By the time it emerges from the drying chamber it is ready for the next coat and so the process is repeated until the desired surface covering is secured, quickly.
