It is just recently that he returned to Mexico City, and been appointed Commissioner of Plagues, in charge of the cotton pest control campaign.

Texas has been hampered in its campaign against cotton pests in the past by lack of control measures on the part of surrounding states and Mexico, McDonald said. He declared that the action of the southern government would go far toward helping this state in the eradication of the cotton pests.


