ROADS CAN'T REFUSE COTTON

Special to The Ledger:

CROSBYTON, Tex., Oct. 17 .-Clarence E. Gilmore, Chairman of the Texas Railroad Commission, in answer to a complaint filed with the Texas commission by the West Texas Chamber of Commerce on behalf of the Federated Farm Bureau of Mitchell county states that where a railroad company in Texas refuses to give a shipper of cotton the bill of lading because the platform is overerowded with cotton, that the railroad company has no right to refuse the cotton because it is the opinion of the commission when there is not sufficient platform space to hold all cotton as tendered, a tender by the shipper on the railroad right-of-way is a legal tender and it is the duty of the railroad company to receive and receipt for same.

In other words, the commission considers that under the laws of Texas a failure to have adequate platform space is a disability of the carrier and ought not to inure to the disadvantage of the shipper by delaying the securing of bill of lading.


