This is considerably lower than the last year's market, and is said to be due to the big turkey crop and the big stock of cold storage turkeys left over from last season, which is said to be larger than ever known before in the history of the poultry industry.

E. A. Jeanes, of the Jeanes Produce Co., says that the best market of the season will no doubt prevail between November 1st and November 15th. On account of requiring ten or twelve days to get turkeys on the Eastern markets from this section of the country, all dressed turkeys must be shipped out by the 15th, and then there will be a lull until the Christmas mar-

ket opens up. Considering the number of turkeys in the country and in Ballinger's trade territory, this point should dress out ten car loads of turkeys this season.
