The finishing touch is being put to the repair work on the Ballinger Country Club dam which was washed out last fall. It will be recalled that the first fill-up of the club lake last fall caused the dam to give away and a pretty wide gap was cut through. Water penetrating the embankment before the dirt had time to settle was said to have caused the dam to break. The club suffered a oss of about \$2,000 and its first lake of water as the result of the break in the cam. The gap has been filled in with what is known as a puddle core, the dirt being thoroughly wet when placed in position, and engineers say that it is believed no further loss by the dam breaking will be sustain-


