INDIANS REVERE MOUNT MISTI

in Its Crater.

Volcane Located in the Peruvian Andes Has Ancient Ruins

The Indians thereabouts worship the Andes, with much reverence, regarding it as the source of the earthquakes which have often in past days

laid the neighboring villages in ruins. The superstitions regarding the mountain date from ancient times, says the Detroit News. The ruins of ancient temples have been found within the crater of the volcano and near the top there has been placed a great cross where, in 1677, a party of Spanish priests exorcised the mountain and prayed that it would not erupt again

Harry L. Foster, a "tropical tramp," as he calls himself, says that on the road that passes below the base of the mountains there are (in 1912) two heaps of stones about a half a mile apart, and that the Indians who pass that way religiously carry a stone from one and place it on the other. This is a custom so ancient that none know its origin, the natives believing that, by the performance of this rite, they appease the mountain for their insolence in approaching so near its

sacred person. Since there are about as many people passing one way as the other, the piles of stones are kept approximatery of equal size .- Detroit News.

Smuggled Arms Confiscated.
