

Each pot of water. Never allow plants in jardinieres and bowls to stand in water for any length of time. In addition to the regular watering, plants will reduring the summer, and wash off the leaves. Large-leaved plants, like rubber plants and palms, may be rubbed with water and a sponge or soft rag. This removes the dirt and grease which clogs the breathing pores of the leaves. During the summer it is an excellent plan to put the plant out during the light rains.


