It has been repeatedly reported here that George Brown, who was tried in Ballinger about twelve years ago and sent to the penitentiary for 99 years for killing his wife in Brown county, is dead. Brown is not dead, but is out of prison and making his home at Richland Springs, in San Saha county, according to a man by the name of Jamar, who was here Saturday.

Mr. Jamar came to Ballinger to adjust some trouble which his son got into by passing forged checks at Winters. The boy is alleged to have passed two forged cheeks, was caught and placed in jail here. He wired his father of his trouble and the father came and settled the matter by proving that the boy was only 15 years of age, was a kleptomaniac, caused by being wounded on the head several years ago. The father reimbursed the men who cashed the checks, paid all eosts and carried the lad

Mr. Jamar when asked about George Brown stated that he was making his home in Richland Springs, living with a widowed daughter, was getting old and broken in health.

Brown was brought here from Brown county for trial, the case being transferred to Ballinger on account of the intense feeling there against him. He was charged with killing his wife or the Brown farm near Brownwood by striking her with an iron cudgel while she was asleep. The case attracted much attention.
