WHEELING, West Virginia, April 28 .- Up to a late hour this afternoon four bodies had been recovered from the Ben Wood coal mine which was wrecked by an explosion early this morning. It is not believed that any of the 125 men entombed by the explosion will be brought alive.

WHEELING, West Virginia, April 28.-More than one hundred miners were entombed by an explosion at the Bed Wood Mill Mine of the Wheeling Steel Corporation at Ben Wood, near here, today. The explosion occurred a few minutes after the men went to work this morning. All entries to the mine are blocked by rocks and

Four hours after the terrific blast which is believed to have buried the men alive, rescuers have been unable to enter the underground passageways or make any headway towards recovering any of the bodies.

There is little hope entertained for the trapped miners. The mine is on fire and choked with deadly fumes. It is reported that 125 men went to work this morning and none of them escaped. 
