MINERAL WELLS WINS CONVENTION

The sixth annual convention of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, and perhaps the most successful and by far the largest attended, came to a close at Brownwood Thursday night with the selection of Mineral Wells as the place for holding the 1925 convention.

The campaign for the 1925 meeting was one of the hottest ever waged for any convention. Mineral Wells and Amarillo both putting up a fight which began the first day of the convention and continued almost day and night until the ballot was taken at the closing session Thursday night.

After Fort Worth, with 1536 ballots, had withdrawn its vote, Mineral Wells had 1472 votes and Amarillo 1016, and El Paso 84. On the first ballot Fort Worth split its vote, giving Amarillo 500, Mineral Wells 500 and Eskota 536.

BOMB INJURIES THREE SERVANTS

PEKING, May 16.—A box, which an unknown messenger brought today as a gift to Dr. Wellington Koo, Chinese foreign minister, exploded and seriously wounded three servants whom the minister had ordered to open the box after it had been delivered to him. Dr. Koo was in another room of his residence at the time of the explosion and escaped unhurt.

LYNCH DAVIDSON TO SPEAK HERE TONIGHT

Hon. Lynch Davidson, candidate for governor, is billed to speak at the court house in Ballinger at 8:00 o'clock tonight. Mr. Davidson spent two or three days at Brownwood this week attending the West Texas Chamber of Commerce convention, and is completing a tour which he started through West Texas some time ago, but was forced to cancel on account of being called to Houston on important business. The voters are cordially invited to hear him tonight.

SAXOPHONE BAND WINS IN CONTEST

The Ballinger Saxophone Band won first money in the band contest held in connection with the convention of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce at Brownwood Thursday afternoon. A contest was held each afternoon with different class bands competing. The young bands, or bands which had been organized one year competed Tuesday afternoon, the three and four year bands competed Wednesday afternoon, and five year and more bands and special bands played for the prize money Thursday afternoon. The Ballinger Saxophone Band entered the last contest and was awarded first prize, \$125.

Three bands entered the special band contest, Weatherford, Ballinger and Southland. After the Southland and Ballinger bands had played the Weatherford band withdrew from the contest without playing and Ballinger was an easy winner over the Southland band.

The contests were staged in the auditorium of the Howard Payne College and the musicians played to large crowds each afternoon. The Ballinger band was composed of six pieces, with Robert Stephenson directing; Troy Simpson, C. B. Conn, A. R. Jones, Harry Lynn, R. W. Earnshaw and Homer Carsey composing the saxophone sextet, which brought home the first honors.

AMENDS LAW TO STOP STRIKES

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, May 16.—Railroad strikes or lockouts which would threaten transportation and causing an emergency would result automatically in the filing of suits by the government to throw all roads affected into receiverships, under an amendment to the Howell Barkley bill which was approved today by the Senate sub-committee.

FIRE BOYS EN ROUTE HOME

According to a telegram from the Ballinger fire boys who have been at McKinney this week attending the annual firemen's convention, they left McKinney Friday morning for the trip home. The boys are traveling in five autos. The message stated that the Ballinger team did not win anything in the racing contest.

The Cameron and Belton teams tied for first place in the reel races, each team making a record of 25 1-2 seconds, and the \$700 purse for the first winners was split between the two teams.

Lampasas won second place in 26 3-5 seconds; Taylor was third with time of 26 4-5 seconds. Cisco was selected as the place for holding the 1925 convention.

Sen's confidential secretary declared emphatically today to representatives of the Associated Press who were sent from Hong Kong to the president's headquarters at Canton, that the president was alive and well.

PAID BIG PRICE FOR PROTECTION

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, May 16.—George Remus, the millionaire bootlegger, who is now in the Atlanta penitentiary, testified today before the Senate Daugherty committee that he paid between \$250,000 and \$300,000 to Jess Smith for protection. Smith was the confidential friend of Attorney General Daugherty, who ended his life in Daugherty's apartments.

Remus also declared that James Linton, who he described as a "special assistant to Attorney General Daugherty," helped to "defend" him, was paid about \$9,000. He added, however, that Linton refused to "ask favors or considerations" from the department of justice. Remus said that he also paid from \$1.50 to \$2.50 per case for permits allowing him to take whiskey from a string of distilleries he purchased before prohibition went into effect.

DARWINISM HIT BY CHURCH

(By Associated Press) AUSTIN, May 16.—The questions of "Darwinism" and "modernism" were placed squarely before the national assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in the first business session of the 94th assembly of the church here today.

The theories of Darwinism and modernism came to the front in a resolution demanding that the church stand "squarely and unmovably against these infidel theories."

The resolution was declared by the members of the assembly to be the "hottest" thing before the body and were sent up from the Weatherford, Texas, Presbytery, having been adopted by that Presbytery last April.
