It contains prescriptions and clinical reports and also notes from a still older book, "The Book of Surgery and External Medicine."

Some of the prescriptions, says M. B. Levick in the Menter, are veterinary. Among the ingredients mentioned are the rose, the lotus, goose fat and some drugs used by pharmacists today. including magnesia and iron.

HOPE AND WATER

LIVED LONG ON

But Entombed Miners Did Not Establish Record

Surprise has been expressed that the men rescued from the flooded pit near Falkirk, Scotland, were able to exist for nine days "on hope and water."

In point of fact, it was just because these men had fresh water and did not abandon hope that they not only survived their horrible imprisonment, but were actually able to crawl down to the shaft bottom, unaided, to join their

For a healthy man a nine days' fast is, in itself, no very dreadful ordeal. There are indeed plenty of people who habitually fast at intervals for from three to seven days simply for health' sake, observes Henri Pickard in the Cincinnati Enquirer.

Not, of course, that there is any com parison between lying comfortably is bed without food and existing in th pltch darkness of a flooded coal pit. breathing bad air and always under the hideous uncertainty of whether you will ever get out or not.




