SAND CAVE, Ky., Feb. 5 .- The fate of Floyd Collins, age 35, imprisoned in a cave since last Fri day, was unknown today. After the rescuers had cleared the passage in the cave where Collins had been pinioned, a new cave-in was discovered and all hopes of reaching Collins was abandoned.

Mining machinery is being rushed to the cave in preparation for digging a tunnel as the last resort in reaching the entombed man. The rescuers now have no hopes of reaching him through the natural passage where they have been working.

Collins has been a cave explorer since his boyhood days, and was in the cave when a boulder fell, eatching him by the foot. After rescuers had been at work for three days, a sand slide caused the boulder to move releasing the man's foot, but before he could be removed from the gave another cave blocked the passage. Long before the Holy Roman empire was even thought of, the Carthagenians had constructed a 70-mile aqueduct in northern Africa, using natural cement in the course of their work. The Romans were especially familiar with the use of this material, and the dome of the Pantheon is probably one of the best existing specimens of their concrete work. On many of these old structures the marks left by the wooden forms are still visible.



### HIJMAN LIFE CHEAP IN BUENOS AIRES

Knives Apt to Flash at the Wink of an Eyelash.

The Boca, Ruenos Aires, is one of the most strangely fuscinating places in the world. Seafaring men in Sydney, Marseilles and along the wharves of the London docks will talk of it; but the casual visitor to Buenos Aires, speaking no Spanish and wearing a presentable sait, cannot easily go there, for in the Boca, they say, a man may lose his life for haif a crown or the cont upon his back, writes Arthur Mills from Buenos Aires to the Lonion Dally Mail.

This may well be, for life is cheap in Argentina, whether it be on the great rolling cattle plains of the rugged North or in the fashionable restaurants of Buenos Aires. It was in the Boca that I first saw something of the soul of Argentina, as much perhaps as in the marble halls of the Jockey club or among the picturesque horsemen of Entre Rios maneuvering their vast herds

One Saturday, some while after midnight, I came to a cafe hard by the Pedro de Mendoza. There were assembled in that cafe all manner of men-sailors from a vessel bringing salt from Spain, Americans from a lumber boat, Norwegians, Greeks still coal-begrimed, some British seamen arrived with railway material, estimable Chinese cooks, little wrinkled grinning Japanese, Italians, Syrians, Russlans.

Bolshevik and aristocrat alike concealed beneath tattered coats and a week's growth of stubby beard-some looking for work, some avoiding itthe pariah dogs of a hundred ports. Across the rubbish-littered road, the ships that had brought these men lay at anchor in an endless stretching beit. 
