



ROTTERDAM, Holland, May 9 -A slow clearing of the international European horizon, coupled with a gradual stabilization of exchange rates and prospects of the execution of the Dawes plan enhancing the buying power of Central European notions, are mentioned as favorable factors for this year in the annual report of the Netherlands Shipowners Federation, which controls 656 vessels, or 97 1-2 per cent of the en tire Dutch mercantile marine.

For the present, however, the condition of the freight market imposes extreme economy, says the report, which points out that foreign competition remains exceedingly keen. Dutch, American and English rates of pay for seamen, according to the report, are the highest in the world. They are double the German or Italian
