



NEW EPOCH FOR RHODESIA SEEN IN COTTON GROWING

(By Associated Press) LONDON, May 11.-Rhodesia seems to be standing today at the threshold of a new epoch-the era of cotton." according to Eric A. Nobles, a former director of agriculture, Southern Rhodesia.
