

PLANT DISEASES ARE ATTACKING SHRUBBERY

(By Associated Press)

AUSTIN, May 20 .- Plant diseases known as "black spot" and "leaf spot" are attacknig roses, other ornamental plants and fruit trees throughout Texas because of the recent drouth, J. M. Del Curto, plant pathologist of the state department of agriculture said today. Rains which have followed the continued dry weather have greatly aggravated the attack, he said. The Bordeaux mixture application is recommended as the remedy.






