

AMERICAN GOLD RESUMING a prize of \$100 given by the Texas PRE-WAR FLOW TO RUSSIA

(By Associated Press)

MOSCOW, June 11 .- Although no official relations exist between the United States and Soviet Russia, intimate contact by letter is maintained by Russians living in America with their relatives in Russia. Tens of thousands of Russians in the homeland are supported entirely by remittances received from sons, daughters, fathers or brothers who emigrated to America.

Previous to the World War, an average of \$50,000,000 was sent annually to Russia from the Russians settled in America, Although this sum has never been reached since, the remittances gradually are assuming their prewar level. Last month, for example, a single institution here which makes a specialty of banking business with Americans, handled nearly \$1,000,000 in remittances from Russians in the United States to relatives in


