

COST \$50,000 MONTHLY TO FEED SCURRY LIVESTOCK

(By Associated Press) SNYDER, Tex., Aug. 3 .- It cost \$50,000 a month to buy feedstuff for the livestock in Scurry county during the first six months of this! year, bankers here estimate. while the county has produced an average of 27,000 bales of cotton the last three years, or the equivalent of \$3,000,000. Under the present conditions, dry weather prevailing, little feedstuff has been raised in this section and bankers claim that it will take considerable money to supply feedstuff for the livestock until another crop is made.

A 35 per cent increase in cultivated acreage in Scurry county in the past five years has augmented the acreage to about 125,000. It is estimated that even if dry weather continues, between 18,000 and 20,000 bales of cotton will be produced in 1925 in Scurry county.






