

(By Associated Press) HOUSTON, August 10 .- J. M. Ball, assistant general freight agent of the International & Great Northern and Gulf Coast Lines, estimates that \$3,000,000 has gone into the pockets of farmers in Cherokee and Smith counties from tomatoes alone this sea

From Jacksonville alone, he said, more than 500 cars have been shipped while the estimate of the tomato output of the distriet is from 1,500 to 1,800 cars before the close of the season.

"Some idea of the way this commodity comes pouring in may be realized when I say that during the peak of the season I saw more than 200 trucks and wagons at 19:30 o'clock at night waiting to be inspected and loaded. As late as midnight 50 wagons were awaiting their turn.



ing stations and in superiority of equipment and type of station, declared E. A. Beane, federal supervisor of radio of the Middle Western States, with headquarters here.

The city has about reached the saturation point, he said, and with the exception of one or two permits already given, it is closed to further development.

Chicago and Illinois now have 45 broadcasting stations of the test class, Mr. Beane said. Thirty seven stations, in both A and B classes, are located in Chicago and a 40-mile radius. Sixteen stations are operated within the city limits.

Twenty stations were put in operation in 1924, a year which Mr. Beane described as phenomthal in growth. The newest station to come on the air here

will be WJAZ, the Zenith plant. The city is similarly situated in the manufacturing and distributing field of radio equipment and supplies, Mr. Beane explained. It is the home of seven large radio instrument companies, three manufacturing concerns and upwards of 200 smaller 10c houses


