

These figures, in a nutshell, tell the story of the marvelous growth of the American fair from the humblest beginning to its present-day status as an important factor in agricultural education. They are of especial interest here in view of the approaching Runnels County Fair which will be held in Ballinger on October 13, 14, 15 and 16.

While the fair idea has been taken hold of tremendously in the United States, it is not native to this country. Fairs run back to ancient days, but in the olden times they were more after the manner of a bazaar or market, only held with less frequency, very much like the fairs in vogue in Germany and other European countries today. The American fair traces its ancestry back only to about the middle of the 18th century, when a group of progressive farmers in the Tees River valley in Northeast rn Britain joined to bring their livestock together for comparison.
