WASHINGTON, October 1. solemn warning by Elihu Root that controversies and quarrels come and that mere agreements to not have these things happen are futile, was sounded today in his paper on codification of international law which was presented by Representative Theodore Burton to the Inter-Parliamentary Union's conference here.






