

Death Signs Stare at Cook County's Reckless Motorists (By Associated Press)

CHICAGO, Oct. 6,-"One was killed here.'

Five hundred of these grim agns have been placed on Chicago streets in the campaign against further deaths of children from automobiles.

There were 545 deaths from automoblies in Cook county for 258 days this year or an average More than two a day. Many of these tragedies involved children as thousands of Chicago's youngsters have no other place to play but in the street.

In 1923, the year before the signs were erected, 602 were killed in Chicago by motor cars. In 1924 there were 564 deaths. This year's total is expected to mount to much higher figures.
