

FARMING BEATS "WHITE COLLAR" JOBS IN VALLEY

(By Associated Press)

MERCEDES, Tex., Oct. 14.-Farming in the Rio Grande Valley has outdistanced most "white collar" jobs as a source of net income. A. N. Roach, who farms 20 acres East of here has made \$3,400 net within 15 months. He has kept an account of his outgo and income and says he has the figures to prove it. "I bought 20 acres in May,

1923," he said. "In September I built a house and the following March I planted corn on that portion of the land where I had set out and expected to grow citrus trees. From my corn, I realized \$60 an aere in roasting ears and had plenty of fodder for my stock. The rest of the land I planted to cotton and grew a bale to the acre or a little better.

"After the corn had been har vested, I planted the orchard in carrots and made 400 bushels an sere. I sold the carrots for 50; cents a bushel in the field and then followed with beets which made 300 bushels an acre.

"This spring I planted corn again and it made 65 bushels an aere. Out of two and one-half acres of cotton I realized \$347.50. I have grown beans, potatoes, cabbage and tomatoes with remarkable success. Even with the unfavorable market of this year I have made money.

Summing up his experience Mr. Roach said, "this summer out of the 14 acres I have received \$3,400, have 500 bushels of corn in the crib and have plenty of hay and fodder to feed my stock, and goods are arriving daily. 


