



We re cently stated that Tax Collector showing the amount of taxes due together with a blank form o the eard for writing an order fo poll tax, which taxpayer could return with check in settlemen of his obligations. This was true but the card cannot be mailed in where the poll tax is involved. The taxpayer must either appear in person when he wishes to pay his poll tax, or give the order to someone as his agent.




