





as Taraktogenos kurzii, source of chaulmoogra oil, used in treatment of the dreaded leprosy, has been brought from the heart of the Siam jungles. The seeds of he tree were secured by Explorer Joseph P. Rock of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, scoured the jungles of Siam, Burma, Assam, and Bengal, in making the trit into the home of poisonous reptiles, tigers, wild dephants, and other dangerous beasts. Mr. Rock was followed all one day by a tiger which killed three of the na

Under the direction of Supt Wilbur A. Patton, the seeds were planted and the young trees are now thriving at the U. S. Government Plant Introduction Station. near Miami, Fla. The chautmoogra oil is obtained from the steds of the tree.
