A neighbor discovered the fire and was rushing to the scene when the parents reached the house, but the house was almost ready to fall in, and was soon burned to the ground.

The charred remains of the older child were found on top of bed springs after the fire had died down, and the remains of the baby were found in another location, presumably about where it was left in the high chair. The limbs of the children were burned off only the trunks of the little body being left.

The remains of the children were prepared for burial by Undertaker Lacy, carried to Rowena and turned over to the undertaker, Fred Machotka, at that place, and they will both be buried in one casket in the Catholie cemetery Friday.


