

Veteran Loft Master Has he has made Made Patterns for Famous Craft of U. S. Marine.

Northern; the Maloto, the largest and fastest high-powered passen ger steamship ever built in the United States these are some of the vessels for which Archibald Carrick, tailor of ships, has made the patterns during a career of over thirty years in three famous shipyards.

Few, admiring the graceful lines. and tremendous bulk of a battleship or ocean liner, realize that there is anything in common between the making of a suit of clothes or a woman's dress and the construction of a ship of war or a palatial passenger steamer. Yet patterns are as essential for the shipbuilder as for the tailor, and all the parts of the hull of a steel vessel are first said out, in full dimensions, in paper or wood.

#### A Heavy Responsibility


The function of the man responsible for these patterns is a vitally important one. An incorrect pattern invariably means an incorrectly designed shape which in turn means infinite trouble and costly delay. A long apprenticeship, therefore, is essential for the tailor of ships, or toft Master as he is called in shipping parlance, before he is competent to undertake his duties. 


