## FIRE COMPANY MAKES REPORT

The Ballinger Fire Department met at the city hall Wednesday night in regular monthly session to transact business of importance coming before the body.

The department voted to pay all expenses of their secretary, Joe Foreman, who was recently hurt in answering a fire call when the car in which he was riding collided with a fire truck and his leg was broken in two places. It was also voted to pay for damages done to the car which was the property of Lucus Campbell, and which received considerable damage in the smash. The department expressed the wish that Dr. Maeune, the Halley & Love Sanitarium, and Jno. A. Weeks be thanked for their help in the treatment of the injured man. The sanitarium and Mr. Weeks presented their bills to the company marked paid, and Dr. Maeune only made a very small charge for his services.

Delegates to the State Firemen's Association Convention, which will meet at Harlingen, Texas, on June 8, 9, 10 and 11 were appointed. The delegates are Chester Cherry and J. D. Motley, with Jim Dumean and Mitchel Moore, alternates. L. Cohen is a delegate-at-large, and will attend the meeting as well as several other members of the Ballinger company. The department will not take a racing team to the convention this year as has been the custom in the past.

The annual report, which was tabulated and forwarded to the state fire board, showing the activities of the local fire fighters and giving data connected with the work, makes a good showing for the two local companies.

The present organization of fire fighters was organized with two companies of eighteen men each on October 8, 1919, and since that date the organization has been maintained on a most substantial basis.

## RADIO MEASURE GETS APPROVAL

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, April 29.—Ignoring President Coolidge's warning against establishing any more independent federal agencies, the Senate interstate commerce committee today approved the radio bill providing for control of air communication by a commission.

The Supreme Court recently held that the Interstate Commerce Commission has no legal right to regulate wave lengths in radio broadcasting, and the ruling precipitated a campaign for congress to pass a law governing broadcasting.

The commission proposed would have the supreme power in its field of activities, the committee having eliminated a provision for appeals to the courts to compel the issuing of broadcasting licenses or prevent rescinding them.

## DEDICATE RADIO TO BALLINGER

R. F. Lane, local representative of the Southland Life Insurance Company, is in receipt of a notice from his company stating that the morning radio exercise program for Wednesday, May 5, will be dedicated to Ballinger.

The radio fans who tune in at 6:30 each morning, except Sunday, on Station WFAA, Dallas, are familiar with the Southland Life Insurance Company's health exercise. The early program is broadcast from 6:30 to 7:30, and the exercise is being taken over the radio by over 40,000 people, according to reports received at the broadcasting station and the insurance company's office.

The dedication exercises will precede the second exercise period which begins at 6:15 next Wednesday, and no doubt Ballinger listeners will tune in to hear what will be put on the air for Ballinger, and which will be picked up by more than 40,000 people throughout the United States. There are quite a number of local radio fans who are members of the health exercise class, according to a report from the company to Mr. Lane, and it is in their honor that the program is being dedicated to Ballinger.

## FORMER BALLINGER MAN IS SUCCESSFUL

The many friends of W. B. Ray, a former Ballinger citizen, will be glad to know that he is succeeding in the Corpus Christi section where he taking a hand in helping to develop the coastal region of Texas.

According to a story carried in the Corpus Christi Caller, Mr. Ray recently figured in a 16,000-acre land deal in which he invested more than a quarter of a million dollars. He is subdividing the land into small tracts and selling it to farmers, but will retain 3,000 acres for himself, according to the newspaper report.

The land is located in San Patricio county, and is all fine black soil. The land is being cleared under contract in blocks of 1,000 acres, and put on the market as fast as made ready for cultivation. Only 500 acres of the 16,000-acre ranch was in cultivation when Mr. Ray purchased it.

(By Associated Press) ROME, April 29.—King Emmanuel today inaugurated the first world forestry congress with 800 delegates representing fifty-eight nations in attendance.

Secretary Dana, head of the Society of American Forestry, advocated closer relations among foresters of the world. He assured the congress of the United States' desire to co-operate with the other countries in this respect.

## APPROVES UNION CHURCH SYNODS MOODY HOLDS UP ROAD WARRANTS

(By Associated Press) SAN ANTONIO, April 29.—Delegates to the Texas District Evangelical Lutheran Convention here have unanimously approved the organization of the First Evangelical Lutheran Church of America by the Iowa, Ohio and Buffalo synods.

Before the consolidation is finally effected other conventions in Iowa and Illinois must vote favorably. Final action is expected to be taken in 1928.

## SUBWAY PROGRAM IS OFFERED AT HOUSTON

(By Associated Press) HOUSTON, Apr. 29.—An ambitious program of subway construction has been laid before the city commissioners of Houston. Cost of the program would be several hundred thousand dollars. The largest amount would be spent on subways on both sides of the congested turning basin area, the heart of the city's shipping activities.

Railroad companies, whose tracks are affected by the plan, have been approached in an effort to have the companies pay half the cost. The city has only \$245,000 with which to start the project.

(By Associated Press) PIKEVILLE, Ky., April 29.—William Turner, on trial here charged with the murder of two miners and defrauding an insurance company of \$89,000, was found guilty and given a sentence of life imprisonment by a jury in the circuit court here today.

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, April 29.—Secretary Hoover told the House mining committee today that the importance of developing the American potash mines had been increased during the last few months by the perfection of a combination between the French and German interests which controlled the markets of the world. Hoover urged the enactment of a bill which had passed the Senate to authorize \$350,000 annually for four years for making federal investigation of the potash deposits in the United States.

Potash production is under development in Texas and New Mexico, Hoover told the committee, and he said there were promising prospects for wonderful possibilities.

The Ballinger Oil Mill made its last run for the season Saturday and this week the force is being used to clean up the plant and get all machinery in shape to go through the idle summer period. The mill has had a busy run and for several months has been operated on a day and night shift in order to handle the large amount of cotton seed bought during the season. The plant will be put in A1 condition during the summer with the expectation of handling another big run this fall.

With many Ballinger homeowners lining up in the prettier yards contest this city's appearance should be greatly enhanced. We have many beautiful lawns already and with others entering the campaign the residential section will show a marked improvement.

The Runnels County Fair Association plans to make some needed improvements at Fair Park during the summer. One work will be the tearing down of the West row of sheds and throwing the carnival grounds open with the entrance. This will help to put all the crowd together and will also help appearance of the lot. The lumber will be utilized to build poultry houses in another location.

**A TEXAS PRODUCT MADE MORE FAMOUS**

Built for the purpose, a saw costing \$25,000 is cutting its way through great blocks of Idaho granite and is fashioning the stone to be shipped to New York for place in the \$1,500,000 memorial which is being erected in honor of Theodore Roosevelt. Other saws are doing similar duty for the \$15,000,000 Edison Building in the nation's metropolis. Nine quarries operating within a radius of twelve miles are making Idaho's name a household word all over the continent. Through centuries the Scots have called Aberdeen "the granite city." San Antonio's neighbor has swept this pleasing cognomen from the crown of the town of Dornoch-shippers into its own lap.—Think, in San Antonio Express.

The entire South is in the midst of a mighty development era, and Texas is leading the South in this important work.—Ablene Reporter.

Possibly there is no real boom in Texas yet, but the magnates who gave impetus to California's development and the recent boom in Florida, which by the way are said to be petering out, are now turning eyes on Texas, and some sections of the grand old state have already felt the influence of much foreign capital. **PREDICTS HEAVY BETTER HOMES COTTON ACREAGE PROGRAM TONITE**

Statistics published by the J. W. Jay & Co., of New York, after a careful survey of the cotton growing states of the nation, show that the probable cotton acreage of the entire nation for 1926 will be 99 per cent of the 1925 crop. In 1925 there were 46,448,000 acres planted to cotton in the United States, and the estimate for 1926 is placed at 46,000,000 acres.

Texas, it was estimated, would put in 98 per cent of her 1925 acreage—17,871,000 acres—as compared with 18,237,000 acres in cotton in 1925. According to the estimate made after a careful study, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arizona, and California will increase their acreage over last year, with California leading the list with 110 per cent of the 1925 acreage.

Ballinger cotton men opine that the Runnels county crop will decrease about 15 per cent for 1926. However, they point out the fact that much new land is being put into cultivation and that if most of this is planted in cotton, the crop may reach the acreage of 1925. Dry, warm weather is needed at present to allow farmers to get their land ready to plant. Abundance of good seed, plenty of labor and a good moisture point to a favorable start towards another bumper crop.



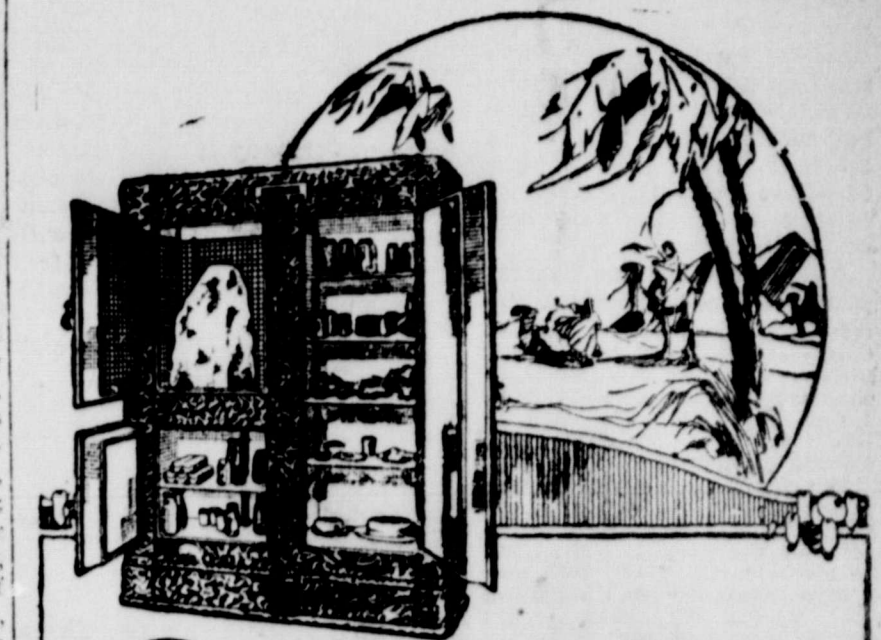

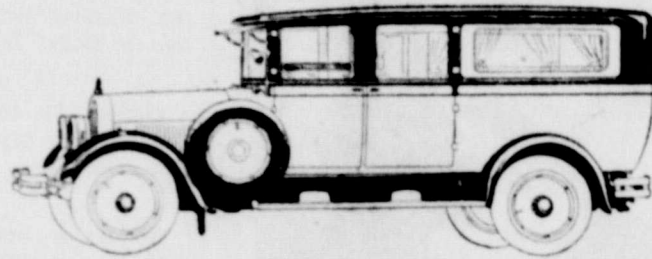
