

Earnie went good with the exception of the fourth frame when Payne at shortstop, dropped a fly ball to let two runs come in to tie and win the game. Earnie gave up only three hits, all singles, while all the Ballinger aggregation could obtain was counted on the first four fingers of the left hand. Earnie got about 12 strike-outs during the nine

Ballinger scored three runs in the first inning off one hit, two walks, a sacrifice and one error. In the third inning they scored one run on a walk and one hit. 
