



Another reason is found in the quick acceleration power of the ear which will step up to 30 miles an hour from a speed of 5 miles an hour in about 13 seconds.

Braking tests have shown an ability to stop the car in twice its own length, from a driving speed of 25 miles an hour.

The four-wheel brakes mechanically operated and are of the type which has been adopted by better than 90 per cent of all European makes of automobiles. This particular type of mechanical brake has been approved by engineers as offering a greater safety than any other type which can be used.
