MAILING OUT BIG FAIR EDITION

The Banner-Ledger, our weekly edition, is going into practically every home in Runnels county this week. The paper is made up in four sections of eight pages each, or a total of thirty-two pages, chock full of advertising for the Runnels County Fair, and merchants' special advertising.

The paper was mailed on early Thursday and gets in the mail in time to reach all subscribers by Saturday. In addition to going to the regular subscribers, a copy is being placed in every mail box on the rural routes of Runnels county, and on some routes in adjoining counties.

This plan was adopted by the executive board of the Runnels

County Fair Association as the best method of advertising the fair this year, as it gives the merchants who advertise a better circulation in which to reach the people.

Instead of issuing a catalog filled with advertising from the different firms this year, the catalog was issued without a line of advertising, and we were asked to issue a fair edition, soliciting the advertisers to help bear the expense of the big edition and at the same time giving the merchants value received for the money spent for advertising their own goods. More than 3,500 copies of the paper have been placed in the mails. In addition to telling the public about the big fair, the advertising campaign will no doubt turn a flood of extra business towards Ballinger.
