### BALLINGER NEEDS MANY RENT HOUSES

Real estate offices, The Ledger office, attorneys offices, and the Chamber of Commerce are visited daily by people coming to Ballinger to make this city home, seeking rent houses, furnished and unfurnished rooms and apart-

During the past few weeks hundreds of people have moved here and more are coming. They must have places to live, and while several new rent houses have been built, the supply does not fill the demand and there are many people now in line for houses

Most of the influx is due to the discovery on August 27th of oil in the Sillix-McMillan No. 1, and the increase in population here has not been of the "overnight" kind, but is steady, and prospects for future development will bring in more inhabitants.

Ballinger needs 50 or more rent houses at present and if prospects prove realities this city will need more than three times that number within the next six months or a year. Several homes are now going up in various sections of the city with plans well worked out for two new resiand western parts of the city. Fall.

The Continental Trading Company was a mere shell, gotten up by these men for their own pur pose, Owen Roberts, governmen counsel, asserted.




