Wilke Terrace Will Be Opened On February 15th

ACQUIT CLARK OF CONTEMPT

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—A. Sheldon Clark, vice-president of the Sinclair Refining Company, today was exonerated of the charge of contempt of court growing out of the jury surveillance by Burns Detective Agency operatives in the Albert Fall-Harry Sinclair conspiracy trial, when Justice Frederick Siddons of District of Columbia Supreme Court, sustained a motion by Clark's counsel for dismissal of the charges.

Attorneys for the other defendants in the case immediately began preparations to present their evidence. This is expected to require two weeks.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—The defense in the Burns-Sinclair contempt trial made an unsuccessful attempt this morning to have Justice Frederick Siddons hold up his decision in denying the defense a motion to dismiss the charges against the six defendants.

Justice Siddons ordered the defense to proceed with the case, following which attorneys for A. Sheldon Clark, vice-president of the Sinclair Refining Company, moved that charges against him be dismissed on the grounds that there was no evidence to support them.

HICKMAN SEES OWN FATE NEAR

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 9.—William Edward Hickman, self-confessed slayer of little Marian Parker, predicted the jury trying him would find him sane and that he would be hanged. Hickman made this statement this morning in the presence of newspaper reporters.

In the meantime, Jerome Walsh, chief of the defense counsel, was making an impassioned plea to the jury. Walsh declared that nobody but a madman would remain in a room with the mutilated body of a child all night.

PROBE USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—Full and complete hearings into the use of Federal Reserve Bank funds for stock exchange "gambling" was ordered by the Senate banking committee today after Senator Robert M. LaFollette, progressive Republican, of Wisconsin, asked an early action on his resolution to restrict loans by reserve banks.

SCHOOL MEET HERE IN MARCH

H. C. Lyon, director general of the Rannels County Interscholastic League, announced Thursday that the county meet would be held in Ballinger on Friday and Saturday, March 23 and 24.

Mr. Lyon is issuing a call to all department heads for a conference here on Wednesday, February 15th at 2:30 o'clock.

This will be one of the most successful meets ever held in the county, Mr. Lyon said.

Operators were still keeping a close eye on Robt. Watchhorn's King No. 1 Thursday afternoon at a depth of 2,548 feet. The bit had passed the pay depth of the Vacuum-McMillan No. 1 by three feet.

Drilling is still in progress.

Belief was expressed here Thursday afternoon that the Watchhorn-King No. 1, two miles southwest of the Vacuum-McMillan No. 1, discovery well, would be a dry hole around 2,600 feet. Many scouts and geologists "sat on the hole" a greater part of Wednesday night and Thursday morning hoping something would develop, but shortly after noon Thursday the bit was reported to be at work at about 2,540 feet.

Operators from San Angelo, Coleman, Brownwood, Abilene, and other cities in this section were here Wednesday, Wednesday night and Thursday awaiting some development at the well. Doubt was expressed Thursday that the well would prove to be an extension of the McMillan pool.

Vacuum-McMillan No. 2 is drilling around 2,500 feet and is expected to be brought in within a day or so. Operators are watching this well very closely. As soon as it is completed, a second offset will be started about 500 feet northeast of the discovery well.

Griswald-Willingham No. 1 is running 10-inch casing to a depth of 1,410 feet Thursday afternoon. This is 2,300 feet southwest of the initial producer.

Gibson & Johnson-Serratt No. 1 was drilling around 1,350 feet Wednesday night.

Empire-Gray No. 1, Swenson-dale-Werner No. 1, and Miles-Lawhon No. 1 are shut down.

May-Schneider No. 1 is underreaming at 1,325 feet.

Globe-Webb No. 1 is drilling at 1,200 feet.

McLean-Clayton No. 1 is drilling around 1,000 feet.

Lindbergh, United States good will ambassador, who received a tumultuous response upon his arrival here yesterday.

Today the hero worship continues and the psychological reaction was reflected in the delegates at the Pan-American Congress. There is a more tranquil good feeling in evidence than heretofore.

The matter of developing air mail service between the United States and Latin-American republics is receiving favorable consideration by the delegates.

JURY SELECTED TO TRY HUERTA



Broadway Will Be Paved If Possible

"We will pave all of Broadway as planned, if it is humanly possible," was about the decision of the City Commission Tuesday night at the regular meeting held at the city hall, with Mayor S. B. Raby, Commissioners E. M. Eubank, W. A. Holt, City Secretary J. R. Lusk, and City Engineer C. L. Davis present.

Mr. Lusk said all of Broadway would be paved if possible, if not a part of the street would be paved and this paving either connected with the Eighth Street work or switched over and down Sixth Street. Property owners on

the first three blocks are said to be solid against the paving, while the upper end is almost solid for the paving.

Meanwhile paving work is going on at a rapid speed on Eighth Street with excavation of several blocks already completed and cement workers now laying curbs and gutter for the paving on the first blocks. It is probable that the first two or three blocks will be opened for travel in a few weeks.

The commission discussed the water situation and also the storm sewer problem in connection with the paving of the five blocks between Tenth Street and the Colorado River bridge on Hutchings Avenue. No definite action was taken in either matter.

Secretary Lusk was ordered to pay all bills approved and to place an order for the printing of street paving warrants.

After considering several other minor matters, the meeting adjourned about 11:30 p. m. to meet

again this month and take up further business.
