The numerous bands which marche along the path of the parade, and the cheering of the more than two and a half million people, who were claimed by the announcers could be heard. An announcer in an airplane circled over the bay and described by radio the water was picked up by the New York over the network of stations throughout the nation and in foreign countries and those who listened in at Ballinger enjoyed the unusual program.
