FRENCH WOMAN SUCCEEDS IN COMMITTING SUICIDE AFTER HER SIXTH ATTEMPT

PROVINS, France, May 31.—For six successive days Mme. Etienne Poehard, age 54, tried to commit suicide, and on the sixth day she succeeded.

She tried to hang herself on the day her husband blew his brains out in a fit of melancholia which was brought on, neighbors said, by his wife's pessimism and parsimony. The rope broke.

On the morning she jumped into the river and was rescued by a laundrywoman. The following morning neighbors found her prostrate from drinking half a bottle of disinfectant and successfully administered an antidote.

The next day she swallowed carbolic acid, which, diluted, lacked effectiveness. Then she threw herself out of the first story window.

On the sixth day she went to the attic, climbed a ladder, attached one end of a short length of rope to a rafter and the nose-end to her neck and jumped. The rope did not break.

Notice

To All Owning or Claiming Any Property abutting upon the herein-below mentioned portions of streets in the City of Ballinger, Texas, and to all owning or claiming any interest in any such property:

The City Commission of the City of Ballinger has ordered that the hereinbelow mentioned portions of streets be improved by raising, grading and filling, and installing concrete curbs and gutters, and paving with one and one-half inch Uvalde Rock Asphalt (cold mixture) on a six inch gravel base, together with incidentals and appurtenances, and contract therefor has been made and entered into with Brown & Root for the making and construction of such improvements. Estimate of the cost of such improvements for each such portion of street has been prepared.

The portions of streets to be improved, together with the estimated cost of the improvements for each such portion of street or highway, and the amount or amounts per front foot proposed to be assessed against abutting property and the owners thereof, on each such portion of street or highway, are as follows, to-wit:

RAILROAD AVENUE, from the west line of Eighth Street to the west line of Ninth Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. 5, estimated cost of improvements is \$4,323.00; the estimated cost per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and owners thereof for curb is \$0.55; the estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against abutting property and owners thereof for improvements, exclusive of curbs is \$4.00; total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed is \$4.55.

NINTH STREET, from the south line of Railroad Avenue to the north line of Strong Avenue, known and designated as Unit or District No. 6, estimated cost of improvements is \$11,165.00; the estimated cost per front foot to be assessed against the abutting property and the owners thereof for curb is \$0.55; the estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against the abutting property and the owners thereof for improvements, exclusive of curbs, is \$4.95; total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed is \$5.50.

STRONG AVENUE, from the west line of Ninth Street to the east line of Sixth Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. 7, estimate cost of improvements is \$23,798.45; the estimated cost per front foot to be assessed against the abutting property and the owners thereof for curb is \$0.56; the estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against the abutting property and the owners thereof for improvements, exclusive of curbs, is \$6.05; total estimated amount to be assessed is \$6.61.

SIXTH STREET, from the south line of Hutchings Avenue to the north line of Strong Avenue, known and designated as Unit or District No. 8, estimated cost of improvements is \$3,495.00; the estimated cost per front foot to be assessed against the abutting property and the owners thereof for curb is \$0.50; the estimated amount per front foot to be assessed against the

abutting property and the owners thereof for improvements, exclusive of curbs, is \$3.55; total estimated amount per front foot to be assessed is \$4.05.

A hearing will be given and held by and before the City Commission of the City of Ballinger, Texas, on the 5th day of June, 1928, at 10 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, in the City of Ballinger, Texas, to all owning or claiming any property abutting upon said portions of streets, and to all owning or claiming any interest in any such property. At said time and place all owning or claiming any such abutting property, or any interest therein, shall be and appear and will be fully heard concerning said improvements, the cost thereof, the amounts to be assessed therefor, the benefits to the respective parcels of abutting property by means of the improvements on the portion of street or highway upon which the property abuts, and concerning the regularity, validity and sufficiency of the contract for, and all proceedings relating to such improvements and proposed assessments therefor, and concerning any matter as to which they are entitled to hearing under the law in force in the City and under the proceedings of the City with reference to said matters. 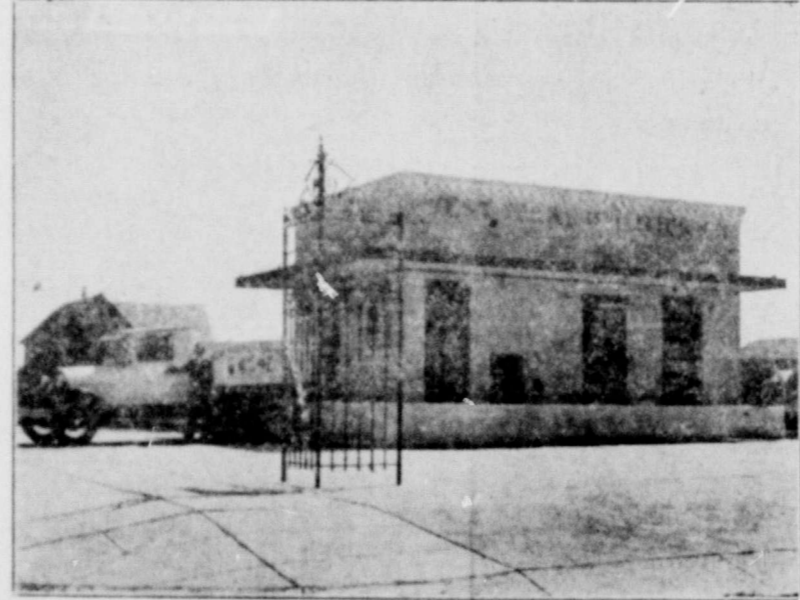
