

SALAD SAVERS



The secret of appetizing salads is mostly having the vegetables fresh and crisp. As soon as they are delivered, lettuce, celery, radishes, parsley and the like should be put in cold water and allowed to freshen. Then remove any withered leaves and cut out Imperfections. Put them in refrigerator bags such as are shown here and set the to on the ice. When you are ready to make the salad, they will be delightfully crisp but not dripping wet as they would be if you waited till then to prepare

A single used flour bag will make a set of four refrigerator bags. Remove the stamping by covering the places with lard or kerosene. Let it stay overnight and then wash in lukewarm water. Sew the bags up the side and turn down an inch and a half hem. Stitch this around again half an inch from the edge to form casing for the tape. The lettuce bag should measure about 10x13 laches when finished, the celery bag, 7x18 inches and the parsier
