They were written to John A. Simpson of Oklahoma City, president of the Farmers Union of Oklahoma.

This opinion of Mr. Hoover was not one newly formed by Governor Pinchot. Under date of February 17, 1918, Governor Pinchot wrote to Henry C. Wallace, Secre tary of Agriculture under Presidents Harding and Coolidge as follows:

"It is curious to find a man born on a farm in Iowa, as Hoover was, showing such blindnes toward everything that affects and controls the farmer, but we both have met cases before where later education had wiped out earlier training. In Hoover' case the mining engineer has won against the earlier farm boy. and has eliminated him.




