## Man Despondent Over Wife's Death Kills Self

Barney Eakin, age 49 years, took his own life by cutting his throat with a pocket knife, almost severing the head, at about 9:30 Tuesday morning.

Living with his mother and sister, in the southern part of the city, Eakin had shown signs of great despondency of late, over the death of his wife, which occurred some

Members of the family were up and about their regular household duties Tuesday morning and Eakin's sister, Mrs. M. T. Keel, hearing a gurgling sound like the trickling of water passing through an air hose looked around just in time to see her brother with his head almost severed, stagger and fall to the floor.

Eakin was a day laborer and the family occupied a small house near the Abilene & Southern tracks in the southern part of the city. Of late he had been picking cotton. He had been a resident of Ballinger for about a year and had lived in Runnels county for two or three years.

A physician was called but could do nothing to revive the man. Deputy Sheriff John White was called and after interrogating several witnesses decided that an inquest was not necessary.

This is Eakin's second attempt at self destruction, he having tried about a week ago, but was persuaded by members of his family to forego the awful tragedy. He was the father of four sons.

Funeral arrangements had not been made at last reports, however, Higginbotham Bros. & Co. were preparing the body for burial.
